powered ladies as they plow through work, play, love and cocktails. It's the highly anticipated network update to *Sex and the City*.

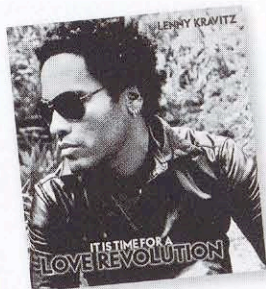

• *Lenny Kravitz* (in stores Feb. 5)

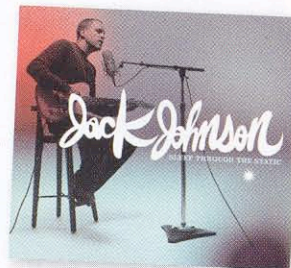

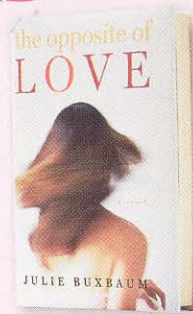
